The horse show management reserves the right to itself, to refuse, limit, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries; disqualify any riders or exhibitors thereby canceling awarded prizes/ to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to change rings or officials, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants and to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind.

- PARKING** In designated areas only, and **NO PARKING IN FIRE LANES.** Show management reserves the right to ask anyone to move their cars, trucks, trailers, vans, etc. at any time.
- GOLF CARTS** Golf carts will NOT be available for rental at this show.
- CONCESSIONS** Available on grounds.
- REFUNDS** Fees for classes not ridden in may be refunded if scratched. The greater of ½ of Stall fees reserved (1 or 2 nights &/or day stalls), or \$15 shall be charged if stalls are cancelled 48 hours or less prior to the show. **(Returned checks /other non-negotiable payment = \$35 fee charged)**
- LUNGEING** Lungeing will be limited and is permitted in designated areas. **PLEASE**, NO lungeing in any areas **DURING** or **AFTER** tractor ring work, unless in a **specified** area.
- RESPONSIBILITY** All owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, employees and animals to stalls, buildings and any other properties on the show grounds and will be billed accordingly.

RING/EXHIBITOR CONDUCT

If the courtesy circle is restricted, it shall be announced, and also be indicated on the course diagram. A corresponding barrier will be erected in the arena. If said restrictions are not observed, the rider shall be disqualified. Jumping orders may be posted at the in-gate. Jumping orders *may* be pre-posted and rolled. Post entries will be added to the top of the jump order. Please advise the paddock master of any conflicts.

MEDICAL WASTE

Due to Federal Regulations, all medical waste must be separated. Receptacles are provided for disposal of hypodermic needles in Please do not mix with manure waste or trash cans.

POINTS & MEMBERSHIPS

All riders &/or horses need **NOT** be members of the USHJA, the INHJA, or any other organization to compete in **any** class (*other than select Medal Classes where noted in Prize List*), and all horses and riders otherwise qualified will receive NHJSSC points. However to receive USHJA &/or INHJA points, riders &/or horses must have respectively, USHJA &/or INHJA Outreach level or above.

TRAINER SPLITS

Quail Run Horse Centre, Inc. offers a service to trainers that allows the trainer to purchase shavings, feed, tack stalls, etc. directly from the Horse Show and then split the total amount for some or all of these items and have it charged directly to their client's horse show bill, IF the trainer provides a signed, open check. Only dollar amounts will be split (not quantities).

HAY & BEDDING: Hay and shavings are available through the horse show office. For deliveries prior to arrival, please call Patrice Urban at (402) 689-0669. NO STRAW will be available and is NOT to be used as bedding. There will be a \$20.00 per horse stall disposal fee charged if straw is used for such.

PARENTS - If not accompanying minor, please send Permission for Medical Treatment (*responsibility for care*) w/ trainer or responsible adult.

SCHOOLING

Whenever a rider is mounted at any time, the horse / rider number must be worn and be visible on the horse or rider, and all riders MUST wear properly fastened, protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Numbers will NOT be issued by the secretary, nor will any horse enter any ring(s) (Schooling Included) until entry forms are correctly, and completely filled out, and arrangements for payment are completed as shown above. No horse or pony may be stabled overnight in a trailer or van on the show grounds.

ALL HORSES & NON-STAFF MUST LEAVE ANY AREA upon entrance of tractor for ring preparation, and no additional schooling in rings after tractor work preparation for show, nor lungeing anywhere other than specifically designated areas, after tractor work, unless otherwise directed by management.

Schooling on the day prior to shows will in available in most rings; **please check shedules.** On mornings of shows days, *conditions permitting*, schooling in designated rings/areas **MAY** be open for 45 min., at management discretion. Regardless of schooling status, ALL arenas/rings (*if open*) will close 30 minutes prior to ring start time of that ring in the mornings. (i.e. if a ring starts at 8:00AM, schooling could be available from 6:45-7:30AM) One or more rings **MAY** possibly be open for schooling over jumps for **45 min.** at the **conclusion** of the day's classes and/or the course set in that ring.

Some arenas **may possibly** be open for schooling **during other designated hours (at management discretion).**

Schooling in Rings will be limited or closed at any time, at management discretion. especially due to weather conditions.

GOLF CARTS AND MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside, will **NOT** be permitted to operate a **motorized vehicle of any kind**, including, but not limited to, **golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles**, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described vehicles, as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The **parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank** as a **parent or guardian** of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely **responsible** for any **damages, claims, losses or actions resulting** from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for **sanctions** against the **parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s)** who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the **child, parent(s) or guardian(s), and/or trainer(s)** from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance equipment for people with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

ATTENTION: ATTIRE AND EQUIPMENT

It is compulsory for all persons when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Hard soled boots or shoes with a heel are also required. Whenever a rider is mounted at any time, the horse / rider number must be worn and be visible on the horse or rider.

STANDARDIZED HUNTER DIVISION

Beginner Hunter /Rider Section / *18" USHJA Outreach Hunter Section: Open to beginner horses/ponies and/or beginner riders, regardless of age. **The horses are to be judged as to suitability for carrying a beginning rider.** Consistent trotting of the course will not be penalized. Fences not to exceed 18". Under Saddle class to be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both directions of the ring. No hand galloping. **Horse/Rider combination may not** cross enter into any other divisions that require them to jump fences higher than 2'3" at the same show.

- 700. Beginner Hunter/ Rider / *18" USHJA Outreach Hunter: Over Fences, 18"

No hand galloping. **Horse/Rider combination may not** cross enter into any other divisions that require them to jump fences higher than 2'6" at the same show.

No hand galloping. **Horse/Rider combination may not** cross enter into any other divisions that require them to jump fences higher than 2'9" at the same show.

STANDARDIZED

EQUITATION DIVISION

Riders entering the equitation divisions should pay special attention to the fact that they may only compete in classes with fence heights varying not more than 6 inches under NHJSSC Rules. This means that a rider competing in the 12" division may enter the 18' division but may not go any higher; and in like fashion, a rider may ride 2' and 2'6" or 2'6" through 3' including 2'9", to receive NHJSSC Points. *^INHJA Schooling Show Point restrictions are based upon Trainer/Exhibitor 'Honor' System, see INHJA Article V.*

Academy Equitation Section / ^INHJA Intro Rider Equitation Section: Open to very beginning riders, regardless of age, in their first two years of showing. Consistent trotting of the course will not be penalized. Riders competing in the academy section for NHJSSC points may not cross enter into any section where the fences exceed 18" to be eligible for NHJSSC Points. Academy section points do not count towards the NHJSSC cumulative high-point year-end equitation award.

750. Academy Equitation / ^INHJA Intro Rider Equitation: - Flat Walk/Trot

Riders may not cross enter into Intermediate and/or Advanced Equitation to be eligible for NHJSSC Points.

Riders may not cross enter into Beginner Equitation to be eligible for NHJSSC Points.

775. NHJSSC Maiden Medal Class (Qualifier Class) / ^INHJA Schooling Show Medal: Open to Junior and Amateur participants in good standing. To be shown over a course of not less than 7 obstacles at 2'3", which must include two changes of direction (change of leads). At the judge's discretion, the top four (4) riders may be asked to test. During the ride off (and the finals) exhibitors are required to use the same equipment that was used in their first phase unless the equipment breaks or is deemed broken.

776. NHJSSC Mini-Medal Class (Qualifier Class) *USHJA Outreach Medal: Open to Junior and Amateur participants in good standing. To be shown over a course of not less than 7 obstacles at 2'6", which must include two changes of direction (change of leads). At the judge's discretion, the top four (4) riders may be asked to test. During the ride off (and the finals) exhibitors are required to use the same equipment that was used in their first phase unless the equipment breaks or is deemed broken.

777. NHJSSC Medal Class (Qualifier Class): Open to Junior and Amateur participants in good standing. To be shown over a course of not less than 7 obstacles at 3', which must include two changes of direction (change of leads). At the judge's discretion, the top four (4) riders may be asked to test. During the ride off (and the finals) exhibitors are required to use the same equipment that was used in their first phase unless the equipment breaks or is deemed broken.

778. NHJSSC Local Day Medal Class (Qualifier Class): Open to Junior and Amateur participants in good standing. Riders may not compete more than one horse in the class. To be shown over a course of at least 8 fences, at choice of two separate heights, first 2'6" and followed by 2'9", which must include at least three jumper-style obstacles (painted rails, no ground lines) and one rollback turn. The International Omaha jump may be used, However show management agrees to use it only for this class. The course's overall design shall encourage efficiency and effective use of aids, riders being judged on efficient and smooth negotiation of the course and rewarded for an efficient track and pace, with emphasis placed on the horse/rider partnership. Extreme speed or lack of control shall be penalized, and rails will be penalized at the judge's discretion. Riders are strongly encouraged to receive guidance from a trainer in order to prevent displaying extreme speed or lack of control whilst on course. Participants must declare the height they wish to jump on their entry form before entering the class. The two heights shall be judged together and the class shall be pinned after all 2'9" participants compete. Show managers are required to award 6 ribbons, and the class will be scored to 8th place. Points awarded based on number of riders in the class.

779. **NHJSSC Benefit Hack Class:** Open to all riders (professionals, amateurs, juniors). To be judged 50% on the rider's equitation, and 50% on the horse's movement. All entry fees (\$5.00 per rider) will be donated to the NHJSSC Scholarship Fund to be awarded annually at the year-end awards banquet to a High School graduating Senior. To determine the winner, emphasis will be placed on academics, horsemanship, and participation in NHJSSC shows. Year-end awards will be awarded to the top 6 participants throughout the current show year. Points accumulated throughout the current show year in the Benefit Hack do not count towards High Point Equitation or High Point Hunter Awards.

To Be Considered for the Scholarship/Requirements:

One (1) scholarship (amount to be determined by the board until a sufficient fund is established) will be reward to a graduating senior participant who demonstrates excellence in school, horsemanship, and extra curricular activities. To be considered for the scholarship, the senior must participate in at least 6 NHJSSC horse shows in the current show season, show in at least 6 Benefit Hack classes, and must be enrolled in high school on January 2nd of the current year. The participant must meet the above described requirements and submit a copy of their last year's and current report card, a list of horse achievements (can be a list of year-end awards, etc.), a list of other achievements (i.e. community service, organizational activities, etc.), and two letters of recommendation. CLASS 392 \$450 UEE Poise & Brilliance Hunter Classic (REALLY FUN!)

First round emphasizes Poise, style, quality and soundness and is given a numerical score of 0 - 100. At the end of the First round, **if the 2nd round is commenced immediately, 5 points** will be added on top of the First round's base score for demonstrating **additional Poise**. (a few moments pause and/or circle are **optional** but will be **considered** in the awarding of the 0 - 10 pt., **Brilliance score for 2nd round**) A rider may opt to come back at the end of their height group for their second round, but then would not receive those 5 points. The 2'6" horses will have three or four (three, if limited by ring size), 2'8" options; 2'9" horses will have four (three if limited by ring size), 3'1" options; 3' horses will have four (or three), 3'2" options; 3'3" horses, will have four (or three), 3'5" options; 3'6 horses, will have four (or three), 3'8" options; 3'9" horses will have four (or three), 3'11" options. Each higher option jumped in the First round results in an additional **1 point** added to the base score.

Second Round, also with a numerical score of 0 - 100, emphasizes **Brilliance**, expression, cleverness and soundness. Each higher option jumped in this round results in **1 point** added to the base, score. An **additional, 0-10** more **points** may, at the judges' discretion, be rewarded for **Brilliance**, and then also added on top of the second round base score.

Highest COMBINED total scores from both of the two rounds places First, and so forth, and will be pinned and announced. Horses not to jog, with soundness considered in the performance of each round and reflected in the judges' scores accordingly.

Open to all horses and ponies otherwise qualified. To fill, a minimum total of **EIGHT (8)** must **compete**. **Formal Attire Requested**.
